Updates from our Secondary School



This term Secondary has seen some exciting and but essential changes to our key stage 4 and 5 programs. Our new management team have been working closely with our education consultant Dr. Omneya Kassabgy to make the correct and necessary changes to our IGCSE system. This will allow us to offer an outstanding high school program to enable our students to achieve the high academic performance they deserve.

In order to raise standards at our IGCSE level we first needed to address what was being taught in KS3. It was evident that from our first meeting with our consultant, that we needed to make sure all our year 9 students had a firm background in the core subjects. As a result of our reviews and meetings with our consultant, we have decided that all our year 9 students will be taught the Cambridge PRE-IGCSE course. As the PRE-IGCSE courses are the core content of the actual IGCSE this gives our students a firm background in these essential core subjects.

Another area we have reviewed is our IGCSE courses. In previous years we have always taught the IGCSE courses over 2 years with the students taking the external examination at the end of the second year. What we noticed with our students is the first year of the 2 years course seemed pointless and they often took a relaxed approach to the year. This left the students in a panic when they realised that almost all of the course had been taught and they had not really studied well during the first year.

Message from Head of Secondary

As a result of these observations we have decided that the current year 9, when they move into year 10, will study their IGCSE subjects over one year not two. When year 9 students move into year 10 next year they will take 5 condensed IGCSE courses. In year 11 they will be able to study the remaining 3 IGCSE's and two or three AS levels.

A very important area that we have addressed this year is our approach to options. We felt that students and parents were not fully informed regarding option choices and the university courses that each course led to. In order to ensure that both parents and students were fully informed we held **our first options evening**, in which students and their parents were given information on our courses and detailed information on the requirements for the different schools of education at the Egyptian universities.





Before students in years 9, 10 and 11 made the final decision on their option choices they were given a one to one counselling session. In these sessions the counsellor spoke to them about their possible university and course as well as their future career aspirations. The students options choices were then check to ensure that they were making the right choice now to enable them to reach their goals.



SKILLS TO BE ACQUIRED


